Description: The *Preparedness and Response to Agricultural Terrorism* course provides participants with the skills they need to prepare for, respond to, and recover from a terrorist attack to agriculture – the nation’s food supply. Participants will be trained to identify and recruit those whose daily activities place them in a unique position to identify potential threats to the cultivation, production, processing, transportation, or distribution of the nation’s food supply. Participants will develop an incident-response plan for their area and learn to identify and obtain the federal, state, county, and municipal resources prevent and/or deter agricultural terrorism.

Instructors: Representatives from the National Center for Biomedical Research & Training (NCBRT), Academy of Counter-Terrorist Education, Louisiana State University and A&M College.

Audience: Supervisory/management level individuals in the food industry (farm to table), regulatory, epidemiologists, emergency management, law enforcement, food processing and distribution trade associations, research and extension services, food sector academia and emergency planners.
